2016 is the first year of implementing the SDGs and the 71st anniversary of the UN's creation and the design plays on the link between 71 and 17 and offers the opportunity to use events and activities to mark the UN Day to also highlight the 17 goals and support the implementation of the 2030 Agenda.

Vienna International Model United Nations 2016

The Academic Forum for Foreign Affairs recently celebrated the 21st edition of the Vienna Model United Nations (VIMUN), which was held in the Austrian capital from 31 July to 4 August 2016. Model United Nations Conferences are an educational simulation in which students can learn about diplomacy, international relations, and the United Nations. They involve and teach researching, public speaking, debating, and writing skills, in addition to critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership abilities. VIMUN takes place at the United Nations Office at Vienna and is attended by participants from 45 countries. This year, the delegates at VIMUN negotiated in six different committees about human rights, nuclear terrorism, protection of civilians in armed conflicts, genetic manipulation, human trafficking and the global employment crisis.

Transparency International

From villages in rural India to the corridors of power in Brussels, Transparency International gives voice to the victims and witnesses of corruption. It works together with governments, businesses and citizens to stop the abuse of power, bribery and secret deals and envisions a world in which government business, civil society and the daily lives of people are free of corruption. Transparency International understands itself as the global civil society organization leading the fight against corruption, bringing people together in a powerful worldwide coalition to end the devastating impact of corruption on men, women and children around the world.

Created in 1993, the organisation is now active with more than 100 national chapters worldwide and an international secretariat in Berlin. The organisation does not undertake investigations on single cases of corruption or expose individual cases. It develops tools for fighting corruption and works with other civil society organizations, companies and governments to implement them.

Since 1995, Transparency International has published the Corruption Perceptions Index which annually ranks countries by their perceived levels of corruption, defined as "the misuse of public power for private benefit", a scale from 100 (very clean) to 0 (highly corrupt). It is determined by expert assessments and opinion surveys. Transparency International became associated with DPI in 2003.
